Cainscross Town Council's Strategic Plan 2023-25

Cainscross is on the western outskirts of Stroud and forms part of the Stroud urban area. The parish includes the communities of Ebley, Cashes Green East and West, Cainscross and part of Dudbridge. The population of the civil parish in 2020 was 6,990.

Cainscross Town Council is one of over 10,000 local councils in England. Parish and Town Council's make up the first tier of local government in most parts of the country. Cainscross Town Council (formally Parish Council) was established in 1990

The Council is a democratically elected public body and has elections every four years for the 13 places on the council. Councillors are not paid and give up their time freely to serve the local community.

The powers and duties of Town and Parish Councils have been determined by central government legislation over many years.

- > Democracy to give all parishioners a voice
- > Services to provide a range of services to the local community
- Maintain and Improve the area we live and work in
- Supporting the community

Cainscross Town Council raises money for its local services through a charge on the council tax known as the precept. The precept for the year 2023/24 is £300,192. Other sources of income include room hire, sports pitch hire and car boot sales. The Council also has reserves which are earmarked for delivering certain planned and specific projects.

The Council also employ a range of staff to help deliver local services and to support the elected councillors, they are as follows: Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer, Assistant Clerk, Project Officer, Finance Assistant and two Ground staff.
