The installation of sound reduction panels in the hall in the Pavilion, Victory Park has significantly enhanced the accessibility and appeal for our community users.

Our own experience and general feedback, since the community hall opened in 2019, has proven that there were problems with the acoustics in the space; users often found it hard to hear when attending events.

The panels that have been installed, effectively reduce echoes and reverberation, ensuring clear speech and sound quality. The panels were also chosen to blend in with the hall's décor, so that they add a visual appeal without being intrusive.

BIODIVERSITY SUCCESS IS BLOOMING IN THE PARISH



Earlier this year with the help of Stroud Valleys Project we planted 3 pollinator patches in Elm Road Playing Field as part of our Biodiversity Project. One at the top of the playing field near the entrance to the nature reserve, one either side of the willow harbor and one around the notice board by the play area.

Its good to see that despite a dry spell shortly after planting, the

beds are now showing colourful wild flowers which will be great for the pollinators who visit them.

Borage poppies along with other wildflowers have sprung up and now add a splash of colour to the area.



This morning I noticed a couple of our smallest native butterflies - The 'Small Blue' enjoying visiting the flowers and this alone shows that the decision to add wildflower beds to the playing field was worthwhile. - **Cllr Clive White**

Our Mixed Ability Rugby team train every Monday from 6pm -7pm, all year round. For more information, contact Darren on 07846 361 243.



Now that the dust has settled on the elections – mine in May, as well as the other one! I've been asked to tell you a bit about my role as your Police and Crime Commissioner as well as the councillor advocacy project, which I hope you will be as excited about as I am.

First, let me say how privileged I was to be re-elected for a second term. It was a very tough campaign and the result was much closer than three years



The Government's job description says the PCC's first duty is to cut crime. However, to avoid confusion, I do not run the Police. That is still the job of the Chief Constable, who has day-to-day control of the operational side of the organisation. In essence, my task is to set down what the policing priorities should be, write the budget – which includes setting the council tax precept - be the voice of the public in policing matters and hold the Chief Constable to account with regard to the Constabulary's performance.

So then, what about the Councillor Advocacy Scheme (CAS)? The first thing to say is that I am a great supporter and believer in the principle of public service. Before being elected PCC, I was proud to serve as a local councillor for many years and I have the utmost respect for all those who give up their time freely with the sole aim of helping to make their community a better place. Tapping into your network seems an excellent way to improve communication between local representatives, the police and myself. It is based on a programme that was developed in Devon and Cornwall and you can find out more about it here. We've been up and running for about nine months and I'm keen to strengthen the seeds we have sewn.

My office and the police already work closely with communities on things like Community Speed Watch, which is designed to reduce speeding and tackle other road safety concerns. We are also, addressing anti-social behaviour by working with the police and other partners to focus on specific problem areas.

I am confident that the Councillor Advocacy Scheme will strengthen the relationships between the local councils and the constabulary, with regular meetings and localised updates and I look forward to working with your local representatives.

A tip to help your plants thrive...

A useful alternative to chemicals:

Protect your garden with eco-friendly pesticides or herbicides.

To avoid the use of the hazardous, synthetic chemicals, many gardeners are instead using home made eco-friendly alternatives to protect their plants. To avoid harm to yourself, pets, and wildlife, you should use natural pesticides and herbicides.

Such products have proven effective against plant diseases and pests, but they do not destroy the environment, and fruits and vegetables grown with them, are safe to eat.

Crushed garlic mixed with boiling water and left overnight to still, is one tried and tested method, but another is to use crushed tomato leaves in a similar manner. The foliage of the tomato contains alkaloids which are built-in defence systems and are toxic to aphids, but also attract their natural predators, ladybirds. Making this pesticide spray is cheap, easy, and safe.

Here's what you'll need:

- ·4 cups of tomato leaves
- ·Boiling Water
- ·Mineral oil
- ·Washing up liquid
- Sprayer

Add 2 cups of finely chopped tomato leaves to 2 cups of boiling water and leave to soak overnight. Add the remaining 2 cups of chopped leaves to 50 ml of mineral oil and soak overnight. Strain both solutions through cheesecloth into a jar and add 5 ml of washing up liquid to the mix.

To make a spray - mix two tablespoons with 500 ml of water in a spray bottle and apply!

Before starting treatment, be sure to test the spray effect on small areas. If you see any yellowing or drying of the leaves, add more water to your mix before liberally applying it to your garden.


