Crowdfunder campaign to renew bike track

Cainscross Town Council has launched a <u>Crowdfunder campaign</u> to renew its bike pump track at Victory Park.

The Clerk, Jeni, says, "This much-loved track has been in existence since the 1980s but is now coming to the end of its useful life. We have been fundraising, but we need another £10,000 to renew the track.

Sport England has offered us £5,000 if we can first raise £5,000 ourselves on the Crowdfunder platform. Our Crowdfunder campaign has started and will end on 15th December – so we need to hit our target by then.

Community response so far has been fantastic – but we still have a long way to go. By using the <u>link</u> to our Crowdfunder page you can read more about the project, make a pledge and perhaps claim one of the fantastic rewards supplied, very kindly by some of our local businesses.

For example, a pledge of just £10 will enter you into a draw to win a VIP tour of Snow Business for up to six people - Snow Business is the world leader in snow and winter effects for film and television and is not usually open to the public. Other fantastic rewards come from Fiorella, In Stitches, Woody's, The Barber Box, Sainsbury's, Tesco, Majestic Wine, Stonehouse Holistic & Medical Clinic and Chris Handbury School of Qigong. THE CAINSCROSS WALKS AND TREE SPOTTERS GUIDE

Councillors are currently in the process of producing a free coloured brochure with links to online support and resources for tree spotters who happen to find themselves in Cainscross. If this interests you then please read on as we would very much welcome your views and comments. Whilst we would be delighted to receive comments from experts, such as the Arboricultural Association, it would be wonderful to receive comments from aspiring tree spotters too. Your views matter!

The plan, includes four walks in the parish, one for each of the four wards of Cainscross Town Council: **Ebley, Cashes Green West, Cashes Green East and Cainscross**. The brochure will provide a coloured map with each walk identified by a different colour: red, yellow, green and blue (see picture below).

Brief guides to each walk and a challenge for you to identify trees that you might encounter on the walks will also be included. We are fortunate to have some wonderful trees in our parish and surrounding areas - you will be able to view, review or simply just enjoy being with them.

We are still designing the brochure and would welcome suggestions, especially some artwork which might appear on the front and rear panels. If you should wish us to consider your creations for inclusion in the brochure or on our website then please contact Cainscross Town Council staff and we will happy to help.


Our emblem is a kingfisher and so perhaps it would be nice to see that, and of course we need to encourage walkers and tree spotters too.

GALLIPOLI, EBLEY AND 'ALL THE KINGS MEN'

On 12 August 1915, 2nd lieutenant Montagu Barclay Granville Proctor Beauchamp aged 22 years, was killed in action at Gallipoli. He was the eldest son of the Rev Sir Montagu H Proctor Beauchamp and Lady Proctor Beauchamp (nee Barclay) of Ebley Court. Montagu was serving in Turkey alongside his uncle, the sixth Baronet Horace George Proctor Beauchamp, a lieutenant-colonel in the 5th Norfolk (Territorial) Battalion.

On Remembrance Sunday in 1999 a BBC feature length drama, 'All The King's Men', based on a book by Nigel McCery was aired. It traced the formation and fate of E Company of the 5th Norfolk (Territorial) Battalion. All the men in E Company worked on the Sandringham Estate in Norfolk. It was a voluntary, territorial company formed in 1906 by King Edward VII who asked his estate manager, Frank Beck, to recruit the men and act as their leader.

When WW1 started the Sandringhams (E Company) were mobilised with all the other companies of the Norfolk Regimental (Territorial) Force. E Company was amalgamated into the 5th Norfolk (Territorial) Battalion. In 1915 they set sail from Liverpool for Turkey. Despite being aged 54 years and the King urging him not to go; Captain Frank Beck accompanied his men. The Battalion landed at Suvla Bay, Gallipoli on 10 August 1915 and stepped into a living hell. It was freezing cold at night and boiling hot in the day. Snipers were everywhere, disease and mosquitoes were in abundance.

On 12 August the 5th Battalion (which included the Sandringhams) led by Colonel Proctor Beauchamp were ordered to advance against a determined, well-positioned enemy, in broad daylight and with little cover. Captain Frank Beck was at the head of the Sandringhams. As they all moved forward the men were cut down by snippers, shells and machine gun fire. It is believed that Colonel Beauchamp and his men advanced a little ahead of the British line into a wood. Later Colonel Proctor Beauchamp was spotted with another officer in a farm on the far side of a wood. He is reputed to have shouted to his troops 'We've got the village lets hold it'. That was the last anyone heard of Colonel Proctor Beauchamp, his nephew Montagu, Captain Frank Beck, the 5th Norfolk Battalion and the Sandringhams. They simply vanished.

At the end of the war the War Graves Commission searched the Gallipoli battlefields, and 180 corpses were found near the ruins of a small farm, 122 bodies had shoulder flashes of the 5th Norfolk Battalion. During WW1 the Turks were reluctant to take prisoners. The Sandringham men who had worked together had died together. They are remembered on the Helles Memorial in Turkey.

On 14 October 1915 another Ebley family was bereaved. Their son, Edgar Vernon Pearson of the Gloucestershire Regiment died of typhoid after being evacuated to The Red Cross Hospital in Cairo. The Gallipoli Campaign ended on 9th January 1916. It had been a disaster and a major defeat for the British Army - **Crystal Harrison, Local Resident**

Why should you report anti-social behaviour directly to the police?

Sadly this year we have seen an increased amount of anti-social behaviour and criminal damage in our open spaces. We have been working hard in the background to try and combat the problems as best we can, and although we very much encourage residents and park users to report incidents and damages to us, we also ask that you report it directly to the police. Why? As the victim or as someone who has experienced the problem first hand, you are able to relay the issue in real time or much more accurately, this can help build more of a case for police investigations. More detailed and accurate Police records help us and the Community Policing team to build a clear picture of hot spots in the community and therefore opens the opportunity for planned regular patrols or more successful campaigns for funded CCTV in the area.

- 1. How to report a problem to Gloucestershire County Council.
- 2. Go to fixmystreet.gloucestershire.gov.uk
- 3. Enter a Gloucestershire postcode, or street name and area.
- 4. Locate the problem on a map of the area.
- 5. Enter details of the problem.
- 6. Confirm the report and Gloucestershire County Council will investigate.

Butternut Squash Soup



4 servings



Prep: 15 mins Cook: 50 mins

INGREDIENTS

- 1 <u>butternut squash</u>, about 1kg, peeled and deseeded
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 tbsp butter
- 2 onions, diced
- 1 garlic clove, thinly sliced
- 2 mild red chillies, deseeded and finely chopped

850ml hot vegetable stock

4 tbsp <u>crème fraîche</u>, plus more to serve

TIP

USE A SOUP MAKER

Save time and effort by placing all your ingredients in a soup maker and whizzing up a delicious soup in no time.

Method

STEP 1

Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6.

STEP 2

Cut the squash into large cubes, about 4cm/1½in across, then toss in a large roasting tin with 1 tbsp of the olive oil.

STEP 3

Roast for 30 mins, turning once during cooking, until golden and soft.

STEP 4

While the butternut squash cooks, melt the butter with the remaining 1 tbsp olive oil in a large saucepan, then add the onions, garlic clove and three-quarters of the chillies.

STEP 5

Cover and cook on a very low heat for 15-20 mins until the onions are completely soft.

STEP 6

Tip the butternut squash into the pan, add the stock and crème fraîche, then whizz with a stick blender until smooth. For a really silky soup, put the soup into a liquidiser and blitz it in batches.

STEP 7

Return to the pan, gently reheat, then season to taste. Serve the soup in bowls with swirls of crème fraîche and a scattering of the remaining chopped chilli.
